In this context, the **European Journal of Science and Theology** comes as an international journal that accepts for publication peer reviewed original papers, short communications, reviews and conference proceedings on a broad range of topics of interest for both scientists and theologians. The journal's aim is to serve the theological community with information provided and arranged to help them better understand the new scientific discoveries and studies that may be connected by their relevance to their own field or in associated fields. **EJST** also reflect ethical, environmental and societal implications of the work performed by scientists and technologists, intending to contribute actively to European and international debates on these issues. The journal also provides students and newcomers in the field of Science & Theology, a basic tool with which to learn its fundamental and possible applied aspects. With regard to the theological task, **European Journal of Science and Theology** deals mainly with the Christian viewpoints, but multi-religious reflections will also be accepted for analysis.

Another aim of **EJST** is to foster the exchange of ideas among the many disciplines involved in the process of the restoration and conservation of religious artefacts. The journal presents updates of scientific and applied technical research in different fields connected to the conservation and restoration but also wants to facilitate the transfer of knowledge and technology between the factors interested in this activity.

European Journal of Science and Theology seeks to cover not only a European but also an international diversity among its authors, editors and co-workers. The editors performing evaluations for the submitted articles have relevant educational backgrounds and experience to their areas of responsibility. Their knowledge to such a diverse field is extended by consultation with established networks of advisors who participate in the evaluation process when needed.

The journal encourages the intercultural and transnational cooperation, reinforcing the European dimension of the dialogue between, not only Science and Theology, but also between diverse traditions, cultures and regional identities. This aim will be achieved by strong co-operation with national or regional journals working in the field or in related areas, acting as connector between them.
